

Master of Science in Physician Assistant Studies (M.S.)

Arizona School of Health Sciences

The Arizona School of Health Sciences, located in Mesa, Arizona, offers doctoral and master of science degrees in a range of disciplines that advance healthcare by educating compassionate, competent professionals. ASHS' interdisciplinary and technology emphases, and philosophy of body, mind, and spirit treatment, creates an excellent professional educational environment.

Master of Science in Physician Assistant Studies (M.S.)

Physician Assistants (PAs) are healthcare professionals licensed to practice medicine with physician supervision. As part of their comprehensive responsibilities, PAs conduct physical exams, diagnose and treat illnesses, order and interpret tests, counsel on preventive healthcare, write prescriptions and assist in surgery. Within the physician-PA relationship, physician assistants exercise autonomy in medical decision making and provide a broad range of diagnostic and therapeutic services. PA practice may include education, research, and administrative services. PAs are trained in intensive education programs accredited by the Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant (ARC-PA), and are educated in the medical model designed to complement physician training. Upon graduation, PAs are eligible to take the Physician Assistant National Certifying Examination (PANCE) developed by the National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants (NCCPA).

The Curriculum

The Master of Science Physician Assistant Degree Program is an entry-level, 26-month program. The program requires full-time attendance and includes supervised clinical rotations. Courses are designed with an emphasis on a strong academic foundation and clinical practice. Faculty and staff work closely with students, developing the professional attitudes and clinical problem-solving skills necessary for optimum patient care. Graduation from the ASHS Physician Assistant Program requires successful completion of 14 month didactic and 12 month clinical coursework, and a master's level capstone paper.

Application Information

ASHS participates in the Central Application Service for Physician Assistants (CASPA). This service offers applicants an online service for applying to a number of participating PA programs with a single application. Educational consulting service letters are not accepted. Please visit <https://portal.caspaonline.org/> to apply for admission. ***Due to the competitive nature of the application process, it is highly suggested that applicants apply early in the application cycle. It is also suggested that applicants have all courses (including prerequisites) complete before applying.***

Requirements for Admission

- Candidates accepted for admission to the PA Program will have earned a baccalaureate degree or higher from a regionally accredited college or university.
- Applicants must have a minimum 2.75 cumulative grade point average overall (3.00 or higher strongly recommended) and a minimum 2.75 cumulative science grade point average (3.00 or higher strongly recommended) on a 4.00 scale.
- Applicants are expected to be computer literate. Accepted applicants are required to have a laptop computer prior to matriculation.
- Applicants are encouraged to obtain patient care experience, sufficient to recognize the physical & psychological demands of dealing with patients and to appreciate the challenges of being a healthcare professional.
- Applicants must successfully complete all prerequisite courses with a grade of C or higher.
- Applicants who are considered potential candidates must visit ASHS to participate in an applicant interview.
- 2 Letters of Recommendation: (1) Science Faculty member and (2) Physician or Physician Assistant
- The Graduate Records Exam (GRE) is not required or considered as a factor in admission decisions.

Prerequisite Courses (*one course each*)

- Human Anatomy with lab (*course must be completed within 5 years of application date*)
- Human Physiology with lab (*course must be completed within 5 years of application date*)
- Microbiology (*course must be completed within 5 years of application date*)
- Biochemistry
- College algebra or statistics

If you've taken a combined Anatomy & Physiology course, you must have two or more semesters (each with lab). You will not be eligible for admission if these courses have not been completed within 5 years of application date: Human Anatomy w/lab, Human Physiology w/lab and Microbiology.

Application Tips/Suggestions

- Apply early. CASPA opens mid April (the year prior to matriculation). Contact CASPA for specific opening date.
- PA Applications are reviewed in order as they are received (Rolling Admissions). A file will not be reviewed until all required materials are received and the Secondary Fee has been paid.
- Applications completed and received close to the deadline may or may not be reviewed due to the amount of applications received prior to your application.
- It is suggested that all of your prerequisite courses are completed before applying. You may apply with outstanding prerequisites, however, they must be completed before the matriculation date. Keep in mind that an application with any outstanding prerequisite grades may not be as competitive as an application that has completed prerequisites.

Requirements for Matriculation

Once admitted into the ASHS PA program, a matriculant must submit all official transcripts and documentation of:

- Required immunizations as determined by ATSU
- Proof of health insurance as required by ATSU
- Current CPR Certification
- Successful ATSU-approved background check

Tuition and Expenses

2011/2012 tuition and fees:

- Didactic component tuition and fees: \$32,690 + \$1,241 Education Supply Fee
- Clinical component tuition and fees: \$27,825 + \$1,050 Education Supply Fee

Additional expenses include a laptop computer (minimum specifications prescribed by ASHS), books, medical diagnostic equipment, room and board, transportation, health insurance and personal items. *All tuition and fees are subject to change.*

Accreditation

The ARC- PA has granted **Continued Accreditation** to the AT Still University **Physician Assistant Program**. Continued accreditation is an accreditation status granted when a currently accredited program is in compliance with the ARC-PA *Standards*.

Continued Accreditation remains in effect until the program closes or withdraws from the accreditation process or until accreditation is withdrawn for failure to comply with the *Standards*. The approximate date for the next comprehensive review of the program by the ARC-PA will be **March 2014**.
