Ketcham. Additional topics include sciatica, lymphatics, abdominal pathology, endocrines, and polio. Much of the material consists of carbon copies received by Dr. Grace R. McMains (ASO 1904), whose connection with WLJ—such that he ended up with her set of copies—has not been established. Although the material dates from the early 1940s and thus has been placed in the series documenting WLJ's early work, it is possible that he actually acquired the items at a later date. Arranged as found.
- NEAAO subseries: Primarily announcements and programs from NEAAO study sessions and semi-annual meetings. Arranged in reverse chronological order (approx.). Also includes articles of mutual interest apparently passed around among early members of the New England group.
