Program overview

The A.T. Still University-Kirksville College of Osteopathic Medicine (ATSU-KCOM) Still Scholars program provides outstanding sophomore-level undergraduate students the opportunity to reserve early conditional admission to ATSU-KCOM. ATSU-KCOM selects qualified applicants who share the common goal of becoming a doctor of osteopathic medicine (DO). Students that meet the application requirements may apply.

Students accepted into the Still Scholars program do not take the Medical College Admissions Test (MCAT). Those who successfully complete the Still Scholars program pre-matriculation interview and their bachelor's degree are given a reserved conditional acceptance in ATSU-KCOM's entering DO class.

APPLICATION ELIGIBILITY

Students must meet the following requirements at the time of application:

- » Be enrolled full time in any major at a four-year regionally accredited college or university
- » A minimum of 45 semester credit hours (*or equivalent*) completed
- » Two years of full-time study left in academic requirements before graduation with a bachelor's degree
- » Science and cumulative GPA of 3.4 or higher (*on a 4.0 scale*)
- » Received a B or higher in all prerequisite courses (*B- is not accepted*). English, Biology, Physics, General or Inorganic Chemistry, and Organic Chemistry.
- » Completed at least 75 percent of prerequisite coursework required for entry into ATSU-KCOM's DO program
- » Strong shadowing, volunteer, or work experience in a clinical setting (*at least 50 hours*)
- » Significant demonstrated commitment in community service and/or experiences that benefit underserved populations
- » Demonstrated leadership experiences (*strongly preferred*)
- » All pre-requisite courses must be taken at the college level after high school graduation.
