ATSU & National Association of Community Health Centers (NACHC) Research Summit

On Sunday, August 25, 2024 in Atlanta Georgia, ATSU Leadership along with the NACHC leadership gathered for a research summit. The meeting goals were to explore shared interests and priorities to strengthen collaboration, investigate opportunities for external partnerships that could enhance our collective efforts, and identify potential areas for future alignment.

The meeting was open and conversational, encouraging active participation, free-flowing discussion, and collaborative dialogue. NACHC presented organizational updates, maternal health & disparities research, value based transformation framework and other clinical research studies.

Dr. Kim Perry presented an update on the ATSU goals and strategies. Dr. Joy Lewis shared her life experiences and how deep her passion runs to oversee the National Center for Community Health Research. Dr. Marie Jackson shared the progress on four quality improvement projects that ATSRI has partnered with community health centers this year.

Overall, the summit laid the foundation for future alignment and a strong continued partnership with NACHC.
