INTEGRATED COMMUNITY **SERVICE PARTNERSHIPS**

ATSU-ASDOH students complete five external clinical rotations in their fourth year, totaling approximately 24 weeks (37% of total clinical education). Clinical experiences are provided at over 70 sites, which allow the student to have a broad clinical experience and exposure to various models of community and public health dentistry.

Arizona's first dental school, ATSU-ASDOH, opened to address the nation's oral healthcare needs and sought students who aspired to become community-minded leaders and dentists.



ATSU-ASDOH students earn a certificate in public health with dental emphasis, with an option to pursue an MPH degree. This provides students with a broad exposure to public health and equips them to serve the undeserved.

- » Integrated and comprehensive approach to basic sciences within clinical application of skills.
- » Practical preparation for approaching real-world clinical needs in patient-centered care.

FOUR DOMAINS

- 1. Fundamentals of patient management.
- 2. Clinical dentistry.
- 3. Community dentistry.
- 4. Practice management and professional development.

Each domain has a corresponding course offered every semester across the four years. This approach embraces a "spiral curriculum" to revisit topics with greater depth and intentional repetition of concepts. ATSU-ASDOH's adaptable curriculum supports ongoing change, innovative curricular approaches, and the Integrated National Board Dental Examination.

CURRICULAR UPDATES

- » Decompressed curriculum.
 - » Improved deliberate repetition of key concepts.
 - » Decreased "high stakes" summative exams.
 - » Increased formative feedback for ongoing measurement of student progress.
 - » Introduced pass/fail evaluation.
- » Students introduced very early to the clinic in the first year by embracing asynchronous learning.
- » Digital dentistry exposure beginning in Simulation clinic.
- » First external rotation as early as the end of D3 year (optional summer rotation).
- » Added more engaging fourth-year experiences through peer-to-peer leadership opportunities, additional community-based rotations, and advanced elective experiences internally.
