A.T. Still University-Arizona School of Dentistry & Oral Health (ATSU-ASDOH) students complete five external clinical rotations in their fourth year, totaling approximately 24 weeks (37% of total clinical education). - » Integrated and comprehensive approach to basic sciences within clinical application of skills
- » Practical preparation for approaching real-world clinical needs in patient-centered care

- » First clinical external rotation as early as the end of third year (optional summer rotation) for a total of five external rotations
