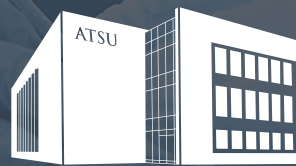

INTERNATIONAL DENTIST TRACK

After successful completion of a special semester-long didactic and clinical simulation course, the international dentist students will join ATSU-MOSDOH's traditional cohort of students in the D3 and D4 years, culminating in a DMD degree.



ST. LOUIS DENTAL CENTER

In partnership with Affinia Healthcare, the 79,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art facility features 101 dental chairs and a dental urgent care center equipped with advanced technology and materials. Students are able to serve a large and diverse patient population from the St. Louis area regardless of age, special needs, or income.

CURRICULUM

- » Prepares caring, technologically adept dental students to become community and educational leaders serving those in need
- » Offers an experience-rich learning environment
- » Approaches patient health as part of an interdisciplinary team
- » Emphasizes the relationship of oral health to total healthcare is an essential component of the mission, teaching, and clinical experiences
- » Emphasizes using cutting-edge technology and digital dentistry to provide high-quality, comprehensive care

DIDACTIC & CLINICAL SIMULATION COURSE

- » Track starts in January for the 2.5-year program
- » This track begins with a semester-long (Jan.-May) intensive foundational course that standardizes student starting points. At the end of this course, upon successfully passing the preclinical and didactic examination, they will join the D3 cohort for the subsequent semester
- » Small class size allows for one-on-one attention and mentoring

D3 and D4 YEARS

- » Dental students provide comprehensive care to patients under the supervision and guidance of experienced, licensed dental faculty.
- » Rotations at community-based clinics in the D4 year may include experiences at health centers and other safety net clinics.
- » Internal rotations in specialty care units provide high-quality specialty care under the mentorship and guidance of experienced specialty dental faculty at the St. Louis Dental Center.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- » U.S. citizen or permanent resident (green card holder)
- » Graduate of a foreign dental school
- » Three letters of recommendation:
 - » Supervising/shadowing dentist
 - » A second dental professional
 - » Supervisor of a community service organization
- » Dental school and postsecondary school transcripts
- » Passed Parts I and II of NBDE or INBDE
- » Demonstrated English proficiency (one of the following)
 - » English as a native language
 - » Graduate of a four-year U.S. university or college (min. BA or BS)
 - » Minimum score of 90 on computer-based TOEFL
