Clinical Requirements for OMS III Students

- * OMS III Core Family Medicine (4 weeks) - 2 blocks
- * OMS III Core Internal Medicine (4 weeks) - 2 blocks
- * OMS III Core Pediatrics (4 weeks) - 1 block
- * OMS III Core Psychiatry (4 weeks) - 1 block
- ** OMS III Core OB-GYN (4 weeks) - 1 block
- ** OMS III Core Surgery (4 weeks) - 1 block
- OMS III: Elective (4 weeks) - 2 blocks - any discipline
- 1 Block = 4 weeks
- * can be completed outpatient and inpatient
- ** must have inpatient component (surgical procedures and OB deliveries)

Clinical requirements for OMS IV students

OMS IV EM Clinical Requirement (4 weeks) - 1 block
OMS IV ICU Clinical Requirement (4 weeks) - 1 block
OMS IV Selective I & II - (4 weeks) - 2 blocks - academic study and adult/pediatrics subspecialty
OMS IV Electives (4 weeks) - 6 blocks - any discipline

Other requirements for clinical rotations

The preceptor of record supervising the student must be a physician.
