Kaelyn Ferguson, AuD


Course Designer and Facilitator AUDP 8480 Branding and Audiology Practice

In April 2024, Bettina Turnbull, AuD, joined colleagues from the Hear the World Foundation on a visit to a project in Bhutan. They visited a school to observe how hearing health checks were conducted on school children. Later, they spent time at a hospital in the city of Thimphu, where they worked with the country's six audiologists to train them on fitting and verifying digital hearing aids on pediatric patients.

Also in 2024, Dr. Turnbull collaborated with Chinese research and development, information technology, and audiology teams to develop an application for the Mandarin QuickSIN test, which has now been rolled out for clinical use.

Transforming learning and care: The role of artificial intelligence in audiology education and clinical practice

Ethical application of artificial intelligence (AI) in education and clinical practice is certainly a hot topic! This was highlighted at the World Congress of Audiology in Paris this past September, where global experts shared insights on how AI is reshaping the profession. From enhancing educational tools to improving clinical diagnostics and decision-making, the possibilities are vast – but so are the ethical challenges. Discussions emphasized the importance of balancing innovation with responsibility, ensuring AI augments rather than replaces human expertise, and maintaining patient-centered care. As AI continues to evolve, it will be critical for audiologists to lead the way in adopting these technologies ethically and effectively.

Post-Professional Doctor of Audiology Program students are equipped with the tools to ethically implement AI in their coursework and professional practice. In their first course, students engage with a comprehensive presentation covering the development of AI, effective use of AI platforms as academic tools, strategies for upholding academic integrity, support for writing and brainstorming, and techniques for critically evaluating AI-generated content.
