ATSU International Student Application Procedure — Simplified

Applying for admission to graduate school with foreign credentials can be a daunting process, but it doesn't have to be!

START BY VISITING APPLY.ATSU.EDU

You will need to create an account. After registering, you will be asked to provide additional information, one step at a time.

PROVIDE YOUR BASIC INFORMATION You will be asked for information like your name, address, and a few optional demographic details.

DEMONSTRATE YOUR ENGLISH PROFICIENCY

There are three routes to qualify your English ability:

- 1. You are a native English speaker.
- 2. You have an undergraduate degree from a U.S. university.
- 3. You can provide acceptable scores from the IELTS or TOEFL exams.

UPLOAD YOUR PORTFOLIO

Your portfolio is your opportunity to showcase your educational and professional experiences to earn ATSU credit.

PROVIDE YOUR CREDENTIAL EVALUATION AND TRANSCRIPTS

Have your credentialing agency send ATSU your evaluation and transcripts. To meet admission requirements, you may want to use World Education Services (WES). To identify deficiencies, you will also want to use Foreign Credentialing Commission on Physical Therapy (FCCPT). An enrollment advisor can assist you.

VERIFY YOUR STATUS AS A PRACTICING PHYSICAL THERAPIST/PHYSIOTHERAPIST

You will need to provide proof of licensure, registration, certificate, or professional recognition of eligibility to practice physical therapy. Please note that U.S. licensure is *not* required for admission.

APPLICATION REVIEW

Your work is done (for now)! ATSU will review your application and all supplemental information.

OFFICIAL OFFER OF ADMISSION

If your application and materials are deemed sufficient, ATSU will extend an official offer of admission and present you with a personalized degree plan. To enroll with ATSU, you will need to officially accept the offer.
