About the public health practicum

- Two components: Applied Practice Experience (APE) and Integrated Learning Experience (ILE).
- APE: Students develop and execute an applied practical experience with a public health organization.
- ILE: Students produce a high-quality, substantive written document aimed at a public health organization.



FAQs

What is a typical week like in an ATSU course?

- Asynchronous: There are specific due dates for assignments, but there aren't specific dates/times that students need to be online or in our online learning management system, Canvas. Our program is designed for working professionals.
- Interaction: Weekly discussion posts where students interact with one another and professors.
- Typical week in a course: Assigned readings, initial discussion post due on Wednesday, discussion response posts, and another type of assignment due on Sunday.
- Time spent on coursework: Eight to 15 hours per week.

Completion time, course offerings, and transfer credit?

- Completion time: Within two years.
- ATSU course offerings: Four 10-week blocks, two per semester, each academic year. Students can begin the program in any of the four blocks.
- Transfer credit: Up to three courses or nine credits may be approved if completed within the last seven years, with a minimum grade of 3.0 in the course.

Are financial aid and scholarships available?

- Financial aid: Federal Direct Stafford
 Unsubsidized and Grad PLUS Loans are offered.

 To be eligible, you must be enrolled at least half time, which is a minimum of five credit hours per semester.
- Scholarships: Accepted students have access to Scholarship Universe through the ATSU portal, where internal and external scholarships are listed.
