# Frequently asked questions

## How does this change the curriculum?

Most courses in the curriculum remain unchanged, though some content has been reorganized into shorter blocks to help students focus on key concepts and reduce session workload. Courses have also been rearranged and moved into different semesters to create a more balanced progression through the program. Additionally, five new courses have been added with two that focus on the University's mission to train healthcare professionals committed to whole-person care.

## Do the number of weeks of clinical experience change?

No, students will still complete three integrated clinical education (ICE) experiences: a 15-week ICE in Year 1 Fall, an 8-week interdisciplinary fall prevention outreach in Year 1 Spring, and a 9-week ICE in Year 2 Spring. In total, students will complete 34 weeks of full-time clinical experiences, including 4 weeks at the end of Year 1 and three 10-week experiences at the end of the program.

## When will I graduate?

Students starting the new curriculum in July 2026 are expected to graduate in December 2028. The official graduation date and ceremony are yet to be determined.

# What does this mean for my acceptance to the program?

Your acceptance to the program is unchanged, and all admissions criteria, including prerequisites, remain the same. Any courses listed in your admissions agreement must be completed before July 1, 2026. If you're unsure, please contact Erlinda Cisneros-Johnson, our program manager.

## How will these changes impact tuition?
